Catch-up Premium - Year 7 (2014-15)



Catch-up funding

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading and/or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). The school received £22,500 (£500 per pupil) funding in March 2015 to support the catch-up students.

Level 3 Catch-up Premium (trend and funding)

2014/15 - 45 pupils £22,500

2015/16 – 39 pupils £19,500

English intervention

25 students entered Year 7 on a Level 3 or below for reading. The students engaged in an extensive reading recovery programme supported by being in a nurture group*, receiving 1:1 intervention and reading support during lesson time. The school uses the Lexia software materials to support reading development. Our Sports Readers' scheme also supports many of these students. Sports Readers takes place in the library before school with pupils receiving help from older students in a supportive, friendly and relaxed environment.

Maths

37 students entered GBHS in September 2014 with a maths test level below level 4.
(19 had achieved level 4+ in English)

Maths intervention

Most students on or below level 3 in maths receive the advantage of being taught in the nurture group* with a regular focus on arithmetic and basic skills; these students also receive 1:1 intervention sessions. The school uses maths whizz (on-line personalised tuition software) to support students' progress both in school and at home.

*The nurture group enables the most vulnerable students to be taught in a small group with a very high adult to student ratio for English, maths, humanities and French.



Catch-up premium 2015-16

Students eligible for catch-up funding

Our baseline entry data for this academic year is as follows:

39 Students are on the catch up programme

19 students entered GBHS in September 2014 with a reading level below level 4

33 students entered GBHS in September 2014 with a maths test level below level 4

(13 Students were below L4 in both Maths and English- reading)

N.B. There are students without KS2 data who will also be supported in school, having been assessed as needing intervention for reading and mathematics
